We will also use our food topic to consider changes such as cooking and melting.

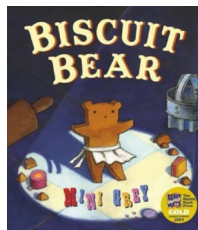


Power of Reading
