Dear Parents of Children with Auto-Adrenaline Injectors (AAIs) in School

EMERGENCY AAIs

Under new Department of Health guidelines, schools are now allowed to purchase AAIs for emergency use where children who are known to have an AAI in school but have either forgotten their AAI or it is empty/broken/out of date. We are in the process of buying these AAIs but in order to use them must have your written permission.

If you have no objection to the school using its emergency AAIs for your child when necessary please complete and return the form overleaf. If you do not give your written permission we will not be able to use the emergency AAIs for your child, regardless of their need.

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CONSENT FORM USE OF EMERGENCY ADRENALINE AUTO-INJECTORS (AAIs)

- 1 I confirm that my child has been diagnosed as requiring an AAI and has been prescribed with an AAI by a GP/consultant.
- 2 My child has a working, in-date AAI, clearly labelled with his/her name, which he/she will either bring into school each day or has a spare one which will be left in school permanently.
- 3 In the event of my child displaying symptoms of anaphylaxis and if his/her AAI is not available or is unusable, I consent for my child to receive adrenaline from an emergency inhaler held by the school for such emergencies.
