

Evaluation of the Same Day Intervention School Case Studies

Your school has been selected as a case study school for the evaluation of the Same Day Intervention. This means, researchers from NatCen would like to visit the school for one day to speak to students and staff involved in the intervention.

Case Study Evaluation Activities

For the next stage of the evaluation, researchers from NatCen would like to visit and conduct:

- A face to face interview with a Year 5 Teacher
- A face to face interview with a Year 5 Teaching Assistant
- A face to face interview with the Headteacher
- A discussion group with a small number of Year 5 pupils.

We'd like to ask school staff about:

- Experiences of implementing and delivering the Same Day Intervention
- Any challenges or barriers to delivering the intervention and whether these have been overcome
- The perceived impact of Same Day Intervention on staff and pupils

We would also like to conduct a small discussion group with 4-6 Year 5 pupils to explore:

- Their views and experiences of Same Day maths lessons
- Their views of Maths more generally.

Using the information collected

NatCen will use the information to write a report on the implementation of the Same Day Intervention, and no names or school names will be mentioned in this report. The report of the findings from this evaluation will be submitted to EEF in December 2019.

There are no right or wrong answers – we are just interested in all participants' views and experiences. There is no need to prepare anything for the interview.

Arranging the Case Study Visits

A researcher from NatCen will be in contact with the school to find a suitable date to visit the school to conduct the interviews with school staff and discussion group with pupils. We will then liaise with the school to arrange the timings of the interviews and discussion group, as well as which pupils will be involved. We will need to gain consent from parents for the pupils who take part in the discussion group and will provide you with a consent letter to send out to parents.

GDPR and data security

We will seek permission from all individuals to record the interviews and group discussions so that we do not miss anything. All recordings will be stored securely and will only be accessible to our research team. NatCen is the data controller and processor for this evaluation. For the use of your personal data to be lawful, we need to meet one (or more) conditions in the data protection legislation, as set out in Article 6(2) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). For the purpose of this project, the relevant condition(s) that we are meeting is 'legitimate interest'.
