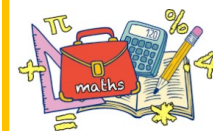

### Maths

In maths we will be continuing our work on measurement including measuring weight and capacity. This will involve a variety of practical investigations measuring water and various weights. We will also be starting to look at telling the time including 12 and 24 hour clocks, digital and analogue clocks and word problems involving time.



### Humanities: History- Romans

This half term, we will be looking at the Romans. In this topic we will be learning about Julius Caesar's attempted invasion, the rise of the Roman Empire, Boudicca's rebellion, making mosaics and learning Roman Numerals. We will also be taking a walk down to the meadows to see where Boudicca crossed the River Welland and become part of a Roman army.



### Power of Reading- The Lost Happy Endings

Our text for this half term is 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy and Jane Ray. This is a fantastic and magical tale about what happens when, one night, a wicked witch steals the happy endings to bedtime stories. It is up to Jub, the keeper of the happy endings to save the day.



### Science: Plants and Shoots

Our science topic for this half term is 'Plants and Shoots.' We will be conducting a range of experiments involving growing plants and the conditions a plants needs in order to grow. We will also be looking at labelling diagrams and collecting data. During the term we will venture down to the Meadows with our quadrats to investigate different species of plants in Stamford.



### Sports

In preparation for Sports Day the children will be practising their athletic skills including sprinting, long distance running, jumping and throwing.



Our second sport for the term will be cricket. The children will be learning the rules of the game, practising their throwing, catching and batting in preparation for their house cricket competition.



### PSHE- Relationships

In this topic children will be looking into relationships with a variety of different people in their lives including family, friends and professionals. Children will also be learning about stranger danger and how to keep themselves safe along with how to be a good global citizen.



Art— The children will be using their science topic as inspiration for plant-based art work.

Music - we will be learning to play new notes on the recorder

ICT- We will be practising publishing some of our literacy work on the computers and using Chatterbox to learn some French.
